Play

1. Place each set of cards facedown in rows. Assign three players to each set of cards.
2. The first player in each group turns over two cards and says the words aloud.
3. If the words on the cards show the singular and plural forms of the same word, the player keeps the cards and takes another turn.
4. If the two cards do not show the singular and plural forms of the same word, the player turns the cards over and the next player takes a turn.

Win

1. Play continues until all cards are matched. Then each player looks at the answer key to check that cards are correctly matched.
2. The player with the most pairs wins!
